Councils will still be required to issue such school entry immunisation certificates as shown above in the following circumstances:

- Children with medical contraindications
- Children whose parents are conscientious objectors
- Children who were immunised overseas but have no documentation

This certificate will either be 'Immunisation Complete' or 'Immunisation Not Complete' depending on individual circumstances. Either scenario is acceptable for school entry immunisation certificates issued by local council immunisation services.
