

All you need to know about *Manangatang and District Hospital*



Improving care

Victoria's public hospitals are doing well and getting better. Over the past five years, the State Government has increased funding to hospitals in country Victoria, which means we are treating more patients than ever before, have increased staff numbers and are investing record amounts of resources in rebuilding our hospitals. All of this adds up to better care for Victorian families.



What does that mean for Manangatang?

Towns like Manangatang need ready access to treatment and services through excellent networks of rural hospitals and health services. This is why the State Government has increased investment in Manangatang's health services, ensuring a healthy system for a healthy region. The following summary outlines the key initiatives provided to the Manangatang region.





Increased investment

Funding increased by over \$260,000 to \$718,000, almost 60 per cent since 1999-2000.

Highlights:

Nurse numbers

- Increased by 1 to 12 nurses, 10 per cent since 1999-2000

Major equipment and infrastructure investment of \$90,600 including:

- Heating and hot water system – \$20,000



Service snapshot 2003–04

- 60 inpatients treated
- 426 inpatient days
- 590 non-admitted patients
- 10 operational residential aged care beds
