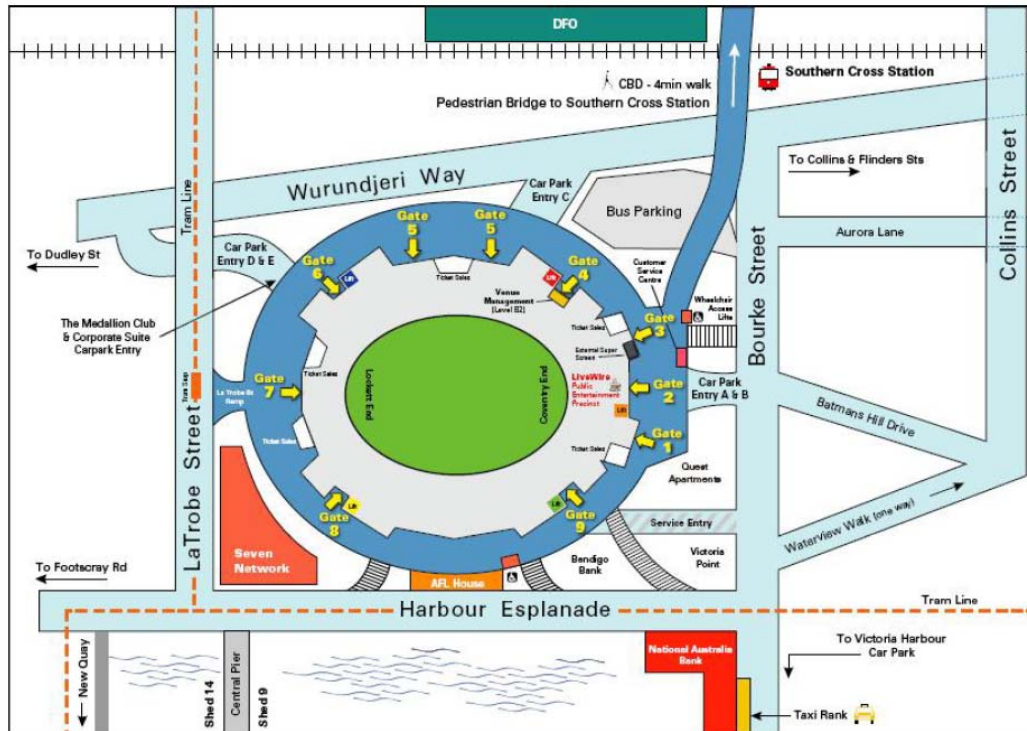

How to get to the Endeavour Room



By Private Vehicle

- Enter the Telstra Dome car park via **Bourke Street - Car Park Entry A** (left ramp).
- When you enter the car park, turn right at Row D (red pillars).
- Proceed to **Gate 4** and take the lift to the **Dining Rooms Level**.

By Taxi

- Direct the taxi to stop at Bourke Street side of the venue.
- Proceed up the steps and turn to your right, proceeding to **Gate 4**.
- Take the lift to the **Dining Rooms Level**.

By Train

- Cross the Bourke Street Pedestrian Bridge from Southern Cross Station.
- When you get to the stadium, turn to your right, proceeding to **Gate 4**.
- Take the lift to the **Dining Rooms Level**.

By Tram

- The Bourke Street, Collins Street, LaTrobe Street and City Circle trams can be utilised to get to Telstra Dome. Please refer to the map once you alight the tram to ascertain the direction you need to travel to and around the venue to get to **Gate 4**.
- Take the lift to the **Dining Rooms Level**.
