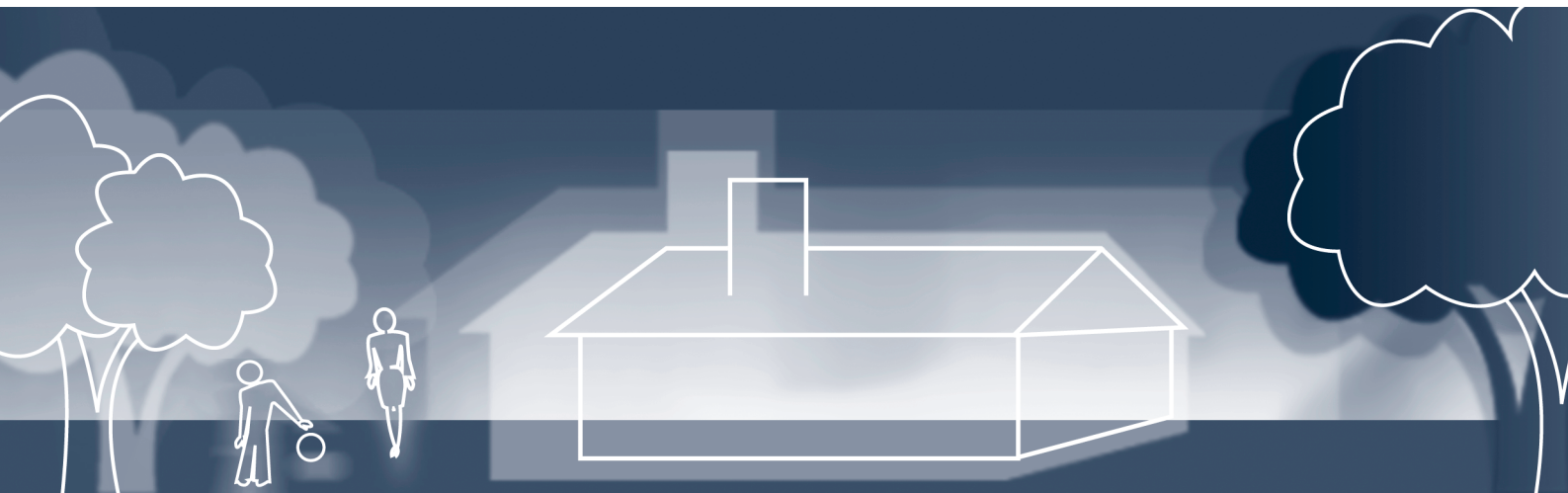

This one-day conference coordinated by the Partnership Development Section, Public Health, aims to highlight and celebrate leading edge work undertaken by Victorian local governments in planning for healthier environments.

This conference will scope current global activities related to healthy planning and the WHO Healthy Cities and Communities approach.

Victorian councils involved in the second round of Good Practice funding will then share their experiences. Topics will include: indicators of sustainability and health, integrated planning, collaborating with other councils and external partners, and community participation.

The *Environments for Health* framework released in 2001 provides the backdrop for the work of local governments.

In the spirit of the Year of the Built Environment the conference will also include a special focus on the role of urban design and the built form in contributing to active, healthy communities.

Who should attend?

Individuals working in public health, health promotion, social and corporate planning, urban design, urban and regional planning, engineering, education, and researchers interested in the built environment, health policy and evaluation.
