I am writing to advise you of required updates to the 2025–26 Statements of Priorities (SoPs) to ensure alignment with National Health Reform Agreement (NHRA) block funding parameters and to support accurate recognition of Commonwealth contributions.

The Independent Hospital and Aged Care Pricing Authority (IHACPA) has confirmed that only published Statements of Priorities will be accepted as evidence. To safeguard Victoria's funding position, an addendum to Part D of your health service's 2025–26 Statement of Priorities (Appendix A) is being provided. This reflects any additional funding your health service has received since your SoP was signed earlier in this financial year to date block funding figures, as set out in Appendix A.
